FY 2022-23, AT A GLANCE

Global Trust and its staff team have done tremendous work to the benefit of persons with disabilities, women and children in the financial year 2022-23. The icon of the programs of our organization is providing Special Education to 135 Intellectually Differently Abled Children and Adults through Global Special School, Samarth Centre and Autism Centre activities which resulted 70% of skill sets were achieved by the beneficiaries through the interventions of the special education.

92 intellectually challenged children and women receiving care and protection under Global Residential Home are being provided healthy nutritious food 3 times a day, snacks and safe drinking water. Also, they were provided health check-ups in every 15 days and health problems are treated according to the doctor's advice at the district headquarters hospital and private hospitals and their health is maintained.

Multimodal therapies like sensory therapy, occupational therapy, Physiotherapy, speech therapy, psychological therapy are provided to the special children and women with intellectual disabilities with qualified and experienced experts. As a result, 60 percent of children and women have improved in their physical activity, speech and eye- hand coordination. Repetitive, steaming behaviour, hyper actions, body rocking and making self-injuries are reduced.

To develop social integration and community interactions for children and adults with intellectual disabilities through activities such as educational tours, temple dharshan, beach, park, train ride, celebrating traditional festivals such as Pongal, Diwali, Christmas, New Year, Ayudha Pooja for create opportunities to participate and integrate them into the community are continuously implemented.





The Global Excellence awards were given to 9 women personalities who have achieved excellence in serving the underprivileged of the society by working effectively in the private and public sectors in efforts to empower women and children who are the most vulnerable in the society. Similarly, training and motivational sessions have been conducted to bring together all, including special children, socio-economic gender and disability, to unleash their potential and guide them to use modern digital technology opportunities safely.

We have appointed legal guardians in Nagapattinam and Ariyalur districts through welfare schemes of National Trust under the department of social justice and empowerment, Central and State governments for execute legal rights of persons with intellectual disabilities on their behalf and to maintain and protect them. We have implemented income generation opportunities through promoting micro enterprise for the differently abled those who are capable of doing petty self-employment. To ensure that all the above programs are being carried out effectively and efficiently with the support of competent staff team, systems and policies are developed and implemented to properly manage human resources, finance and collaborations to enrich their operations.

However, we realize that it is necessary to adapt and strengthen our programs, activities, practices and strategies to take into account the current scenario and the needs and problems of vulnerable people. It is no exaggeration to say that all our stakeholders and collaborative efforts were most instrumental in the successful completion of all the above project activities.

WHERE WE'RE AT TODAY

While looking at the self-review of the project activities of our organisation, it is necessary to evaluate the programs from its results, impacts, lessons learnt and challenges faced during the year 2022-23. Our flagship program Special Education for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities has progressed from the regular mode of training provided in ADL skills, life skills, vocational skills, social interaction and community integration to more innovative processbased training modules. Activities are designed and implemented in a fun and appropriate manner for both children and adults.

All the activities are captured as videos and shared with their parents, so that the parents can also be involved in these activities. This has enabled parents to understand and learn how the training and therapies minimizes the impact of impairments of their children, and how to manage and train them at home. In concern with residential and medical care for children and adults, they are provided with quality, nutritious, personalized meals and snacks that are fully prepared at home which they want to eat and regular medications and treatment are provided with the support of the District Headquarters Hospital.

We involved all stakeholders including parents, officials of district line departments, donors, civil society representatives etc. in all our events and campaigns such as World Women's Day, Children's Day, World Disability Day, and all heritage celebrations and festivals. It was very helpful for us to standardize the organizational functions, mobilize supports, guidance and resources and to socialize our beneficiaries. Various policies such as Human Resource, Vishaka, Child protection, Finance and Compliances are being practiced to ensure quality and effective staff management, financial procedures and utilisation, secure workplace protection for beneficiaries and staff.

Through the above procedures, defects and delays identified earlier in day-to-day operations are rectified through a regular internal monitoring system which results in certification of appreciations from the periodical inspections and reviews conducted by the Central, State and District government departments for satisfactory in program implementations and caring beneficiaries.

We have participated in events, exhibitions, conferences organised by governments and other stakeholders at national and regional levels as well as in social media channels to explore our best practices to attract more visibility in order to mainstream the issues and needs of persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Global Trust has achieved above project activities through continuous efforts within the limited resources. But the present scenario in the development and disability inclusion sector, it needs to be equipped, updated and extend its reach to the unreached.

WHAT WE LACK

As we know that the journey of our organisation is moving towards a goal of creating a sustainable and inclusive society for all likely to be achieved in its lifetime. It relies on the collaborative efforts of the legal framework, Policies, strategic plans for the development of the organisation, dedicative staff team, and resource mobilisation, need of the primary stakeholders, and support of governments, national, international agencies, civil societies and communities. We are adopting all the above factors in our program activities to the best of our capacities in program activities for differently abled and marginalized women and children. However, it is necessary to implement some initiatives in order to overcome the following challenges to deliver outcomes and impacts of project activities to the highest quality.

1.Limitation in providing barrier Free access: We are facing difficulties to provide barrier free access in the fullest level due to implementing our all services in the rented buildings which we made limited modifications.

Therefore, it is necessary to construct an own disability friendly campus that provides various services with optimal design to ensure barrier free access in an appropriate manner for all types of persons with disabilities.

- 2. Resource Mobilisation: As planned to extend our programs such as community based rehabilitation, skill upgradation and livelihood support to the differently abled, marginalised women and children in our operational area, we need to improve resources mobilisation practices in order to reach our services wider.
- 3. Improving partnerships: Considering the new trends in the developmental sector, we need to strengthen our capacities through pooling of various talents by partnering efforts which can help us to deliver quality services with highest priorities.





PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS GLOBAL SPECIAL SCHOOL

A PLACE FOR LEARNING & ACQUIRING NECESARY SKILLS ON SELF HELP, INDEPENDENT LIVING AND LEADING FUTURE LIFE.

Global Residential Special School provides special education to children with intellectual disabilities, Autism, Cerebral palsy and Multiple Disabilities aged between 6 to 14 and 100 children from Cuddalore and surrounding Districts are benefiting out of it. The primary objective of Residential Special Education is to enable mild, moderate, and severely affected children by the above disabilities, depending on the nature of their impairment, to perform their daily living activities by themselves or with the assistance of their parent or caregiver. Secondly, speech and language skill training has been providing to them to pronounce and speak words, understand what others are saying and express to them as best they can. Also, they are being given practical training to understand the prevailing practices in the society in order to better interact with others and integrate them into the society. Reading, Writing, Verbal, Timing, Value and Use of Money, Colour Recognition and Physio, Occupational, Speech, Sensory, Psycho Therapies are provided to achieve the above three important skills. These children are classified into custodial, trainable and educable groups based on the extent of their impairments and are periodically assessed every quarter to find out their skills required for training.



Accordingly, they were trained in 18 domains of skill sets to improve their skills which resulted in the following achievements.

32 Children have problems such as lack of eye contacts, Hyper activity, attention and concentration deficit, repetitive behaviours, lack of social skill, inadequate speech, difficulties in motor skills, aggressiveness, anger outburst, inadequacy in self-care, no emotional expression and delayedsensory issues were identified and therapies for behaviour modification, Speech development, Motor skills and Emotion control was given to these children to treat their issues which resulted the following 21 children were improved

Samarth Centre is a respite home for persons with intellectual disabilities including orphans, poorest of the poor and divided families between the age group of 14 to 35 supported by National Trust under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India. Global trust is one of the registered Organisation of National Trust and provides Care, Protection, life skill training, recreational and Games, Prevocational, Vocational Training and livelihood initiatives to 34 beneficiaries. They have been given therapeutic services such as physio, Occupational, Speech and Psycho therapies to decrease their disability related issues and periodical health check-ups, medical care to prevent and cure for the health issues to them.

These beneficiaries had participated and appreciated to displayed their products such as fancy ornaments, paper bags, handicrafts, seashell products wire bags etc. in the exhibition stall and performed cultural dance in "Talent and Scope of Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities" a National level exhibition organised by National Trust on 02 March 2023 at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar International Centre, New Delhi.

GLOBAL ADULT HOME FOR GIRLS-ID

IMPART LIFE SKILLS AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING WITH SECURED ATMOSPHERE

Global Adult Home for Girls with Intellectual Disabilities is the Department of Differently Abled, Tamilnadu State Government sponsored program, of which 40 adult girls with Intellectual Disabilities aged between 14 to 35 years have been supported. The main focus of this program is to protect them from all kinds of harassment against women and providing home, medical, health and Menstrual care. Apart from that, these women were given training on life skills and domestic skills in order to lead their independent or supported life.

Our organisation is conducting various vocational training like Paper Products making, Cleaning and Toiletries chemical production, Handicrafts, Plastic wire Bags and Fancy Ornaments making. Also opportunities have been created to start production and marketing linkage arrangements to sell their products in state, Central Government organised exhibitions and in regular markets.



These women/Adult Girls were provided opportunities to expose themselves for understanding the rituals of various cultures by organised tours, picnics, Cultural events, Religious festivals etc. As a result of the continued training and social exposures, 30 beneficiaries were trained to care for themselves in day today life, and able to do domestic activities like washing, housekeeping, combing hair, garlanding, folding and keeping dress etc. 30 Girls have skills to produce paper based products, plastic wire bag weaving. Handicrafts Fancy ornament and phenol making, Hand stitching etc.

GLOBAL AUTISM CENTRE

MULTI MODAL STARTEGIES FOR TEACHING CHILDREN WITH AUTISM ARE BASED ON FOUR PERFERENCES ARE THAT VISUAL, AURAL, READ/ WRITE AND KINESTHETIC STRATEGIES.

Global Trust has been given exclusive attention to the children and adults affected by Autism Spectrum Disorder which is most commonly diagnosed in current period through Multi modal therapeutic intervention and special education by our dedicated staff team with support and guidance of Chief Minister's Comprehensive Medical Insurance Scheme, Tamil Nadu and ArupadaiVeedu Medical College, Puducherry. We have provided multi modal therapy along with special Education and Social interaction activities to 22 ASD affected children in the year 2022-23 which resulted in them having decreased steaming behaviours, hyper activities, reduced repetitive behaviours control over emotions and improved in Speech and Language skills.

LEGAL GUARDINSHIP

According to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016, National Trust was established to empower Persons with Intellectual disabilities including Mental retardation, Autism, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabilities in which Global Trust is as one of the registered organisation to implementing "Appointment of Legal Guardianship for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities Program" in Ariyalur and Nagapattinam Districts of Tamilnadu State. This is an essential program to the beneficiaries who are unable to make decisions on their own and avail government welfare schemes, Civil Rights and other benefits from Government and nongovernmental Organisation have access to benefit through their legal guardians. Legal Guardians have been appointed for 54 Persons with Intellectual disabilities in Ariyalur District and 12 no of applications is on processing in Nagapattinam District during FY 2022-23.

PMESAP

MAKING A DIFFERENTLY ABLED PERSON LIVE BY HIS OWN EFFORTS MAKES HIM A PERSON WITH SELF RESPECT

This program was initiated based on the need to restore livelihoods of persons with disabilities while providing relief during the COVID lockdown period. The Aim of the program is to restore and support the differently Abled who have lost their petty self-employment and are willing to start their new petty business at a minimum scale. Therefore, we have initiated to support the differently abled in and around Cuddalore district in 2021- 2022 of which 25 beneficiaries run their petty business and earn at an average of Rs 300/- Per day to meet their family expenses. We have supported 25 Persons with Disabilities to start their selfemployment through our partners like Rotary Club of Cuddalore Town, Coastal City, Lions Club of Cuddalore, Rathavuragal Trust Cuddalore.

GLOBAL TRUST BUILDS AWARENESS ON MENTAL HEALTH

Global Trust was jointly conducted World Mental Health Day on 10th of October 2022 partnering with School of Rehabilitation and Behavioural Science, ArupadaiVeedu Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry in the Global Adult Home for Girls Intellectually Disabled, Cuddalore. The objective and theme of the day's event was to create awareness among parents on Mental Health Issues among children with Developmental Disabilities. Dr. C. Saravanan, Clinical Psychologist, HOD, Department of School of Rehabilitation and Behavioural Science was a resource person to delivered various mental health issues of Children with intellectual Disabilities, early identification and Intervention, rehabilitation and remedies to the parents, special educators, Care givers, staff of global trust. Participants, especially parents, asked many questions about the mental health issues related to their children in the event. Before the awareness meeting Global Trust staff team had participated in a grand awareness rally to disseminate the information about the Mental Health Issues on the same day. The program was organised by the Department of District Mental Health program under the Joint Director Health Services Cuddalore.



This awareness rally was inaugurated and flagged on by the District Collector of Cuddalore Mr. K. Balasubramaniyam . I.A.S and Dr.Sathiyamoorthy, Nodal Officer, District Mental Health Program Cuddalore welcomed all participants in the rally. Hands bills containing information related to Mental Health awareness were distributed to the general public and the participants chanting slogans about the truth behind the mental health issues. Government and Nursing College students, Department Officials participated in the rally from Town hall to Government Headquarters Hospital.

WORLD AUTISM DAY

World Autism Day is observed on 3rd of April every year to raise awareness about Autism. Our organisation, Department of Differently Abled Welfare Office, District Mental Health program of Cuddalore, Mahatma Gandhi, Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry had been joint organised the autism day event on April 30th of 2022 at Global Adult Home for Girls with Intellectual Disabilities. This workshop was conducted on the theme of "Parental Challenges in handling Children affected by Autism impairment" Dr. Sounder Rajan, HOD of the Pediatrics Department, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College Presided over the workshop, Mr. Sundaravadivelu. Orthotic Technician delivered the introductory address on the theme, Dr. Sathiyamoorthy, Nodal Officer, District Mental Health Program, Cuddalore District has discussed understanding about Autism Impairment, Caring Autistic Children, overcoming challenges on handling of those children in the event.

More than 100 parents and siblings of autistic children participated in the event. Dr. Elamaran, Dr, Karthikeyan, Dr. V.P.Karthikeyan and Ms. Monicka ,Clinical Psychologist answered the doubts of the parents and participants . Mrs. M.Kumudham, Founder Chairperson of Global Trust welcomed all the guests and participants at the beginning of the workshop and the event concluded with vote of thanks delivered by Mr. R.A Gopal, Managing Director of Global Trust.
