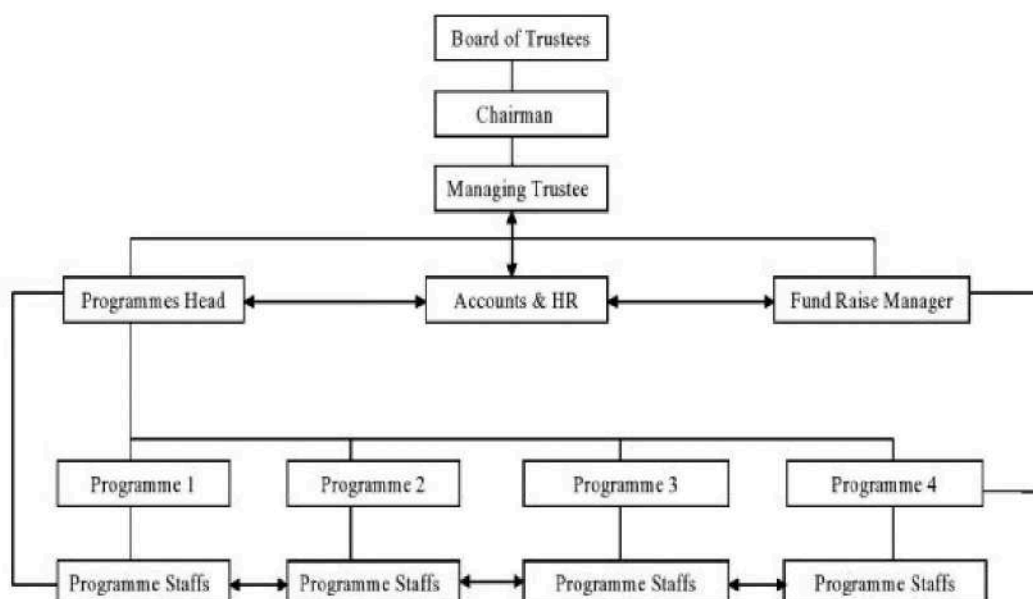

# TIME LINE FOR UPCOMING ACTIVITIES 2024-25

From the field experience we understand, that the existing programs have to improve with new infrastructure facility, technology advancement and more viable to access by the project beneficiaries. The enhancement will be done through the support of new donors.



## MAJOR OUTCOME

Our continuous efforts and intervention in the project activities have given tangible outcomes and it shows to know our commitments and dedication in rehabilitation services to the project beneficiaries.



### FUNCTIONAL & LIFE SKILLS OF CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS.



The focused intervention by adopting universally accepted assessment scales like VSMS, MDPS, CARS & ISSA have improved for 75% the functional Skills like walking, feeding, toileting and simple request (175 children & Adults with Special Needs) as they are now able to lead risk free life on their own & 60% children got their life skills improvement as they can show their emotions for comments.

### HEALTH STATUS ENHANCEMENT



The Residential care and support service has improved the physical and mental health status of 70% (175 Children and Adults with Special Needs) as the balanced diet system, regular medication and therapeutical intervention have assisted them to lead healthier life.

### VOCATIONAL SKILLS



The potential of 40 Adults with Intellectually disabled were identified and 75% of them were trained on making wire basket, Paper Stand, Woolen Thread Bangle, Flower vas and Ear Rings. It made them productive members and small income generated.

### WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

150 women were promoted as micro entrepreneurs and started their livelihood activities at their locality. This has paved the way for contributing to their family income.

10 women leaders from diversified fields have honored with Global Excellence Award. This has motivated gross root women folk to go forward.



### REBUILDING OF PWD'S LIVELIHOOD- PMESAP

30 PwDs who have lost their livelihood due to insufficient financial support and lack of accessibility for credit linkages were supported under PMESAP for various livelihood activities. This has helped to revive their income generation and to lead decent life.



### LEGAL GUARDIANSHIP TO PWDS

Life care assurance reached to 25 PwDs through Legal Guardian certificate in Ariyalur and Nagapattinam Districts.

## GLOBAL SPECIAL SCHOOL

The school was started in 2013 with the main aim to provide care and support service to Children with Intellectual Disabilities. During the year 2023-24, 100 Children were facilitated with residential care and rehabilitation services. Based on the IEP, special training to all 100 children in 761 domains covering 10 skill sets. The intensive training has improved their life skills, Cognitive Skill, Academic Skill and Social skill.



## SAMARTH CENTRE- RESPIRE HOME

The objective of Samarth centre is to provide respite home care service to Persons with Intellectually Disabled and their family members while they are in critical situation. During the year 2023-24, 31 PwDs(ID) were admitted and provided intensive training on various field. All were provided with balanced diet facility. The high priority was given for developing the Like Skills of inmates. 10 PwDs(ID) got opportunity to train on vocational skills.





## ADULT HOME FOR GRILS (ID)

We work to ...

- Include adult with intellectual disabilities as a part of the society.
- Maintain their health condition through counseling service.
- Train them in vocational skills as per their IQ levels.
- Involve them into productivity based activities.
- Facilitate to earn income from their livelihood activities.

During the year 2023-24, 40 Adult Girls with intellectual disabilities enrolled for their Rehabilitation, life skill development and vocational training. they were trained on various skills like making Paper pen stand, Wire Bag, Phenol, hand sewing, woolen thread flowers, bangles and stead making.



## THERAPY CENTRE FOR AUTISM

We are running a multimodal therapy unit for rehabilitating Children with Autism Spectrum Disorders. During the FY 2023-24, attention was given to 20 Autistic Children on Behavioral modification, Emotional control, Speech and Language, Occupational skills, Sensory, Physio Therapies along with Activities for Daily Living Skills. Our tireless service has reached to every nook and corner which encouraged parents to approach for therapy intervention.





## WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Women empowerment is one of the objectives of Global Trust which focuses on developing the education, Training, participation of the marginalised women for uplifting them from all their social and economic barriers. In the year 2023-24, We have been conducting leadership and Entrepreneur development training for 150 women especially minority and socially backward and facilitated them to reach out to the government welfare schemes and economic development.

In addition to this, 10 women leaders were selected from various field of expertise and honored with Global Excellence Award on the day of International Women's Day.



## LIVELIHOOD FOR PWDS

Promoting Micro-Enterprise for the Specially Aabled People (PMESAP). This scheme is an offspring of COVID-19 aimed at supporting Disabled people to resume their livelihood activity at their locality, thereby ensuring them economically self reliant and giving a respectable life.

With the aim of promoting 500 PwDs as Micro Entrepreneur before end of 2025, we have identified eligible PwDs and support them to start their livelihood activity. During the Year 2023-24 we have supported 30 PwDs for various livelihood activities. The immediate outcome of the scheme is that the beneficiaries have started to generate income through their livelihood activities.

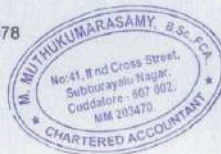

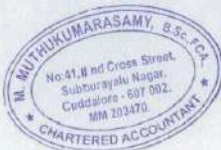

# SUCCESS STORIES...

## *Singing Champion*

**Keerthivasan** an Autistic Child, aged 15, came to Global Special School from Chennai by the help of his aunt in 2018. Tmt. Komal mother of Keerthivasan was deserted by his father and she is no more now. His father has also abandoned him because of his disability. He often exhibited high level hyper activity, aggression, stereotypies, and anxiety. He was also very adamant and demands for snacks and if he does not get it, he bites his hand. He continuously cries. He never mingles with any one and likes loneliness.



At Global Special School, we designed individual goal and started implementing it. On doing so, we have realised that, he was very much interested in singing song. Quickly understanding this, we started make him to sing songs. We started to give him behavioural modification like colouring with hand, beading works, peck board assembling, Buzzles assembling, matching board etc. Through these interventions, he has improved his gross motor. We brought out his talent of singing. He has participated in Talent Event organised by **Spastics society of Tamilnadu** on World Autism day on April02, 2023. He is a singing champion now.

## *From surviving to Thriving*

**Vinothini**, is abandoned female child aged 18, For some reason her grand parents who have taken care, decided to kill her due to severe disability she had. It was noticed by the neighbor namely Isaivani, and rescued her and brought to Global School. She is living here for last 10 years.

Her legs and hands were held together and she was totally crippled. She is a multiple disability and she was totally depended for her daily living.

Comprehensive assessment was carried out and prepared IEP training plan. This has played vital instrument in improving Vinothin's physical condition. She can stand alone with the support of the wall for at least 5 minutes, could able to show finger at what she wants, and could able to start asking for food on her own.

Once it was thought, nothing was possible, now the new horizon of life on the view and she has become from survival to thriving.
