EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Global Trust as an emerging pioneering institution is align with Sustainable Development Goals-SDGs working for the Empowerment of deprived sections of our society specifically for Persons with Disabilities-PwDs, Children and Women. To ensure better results we adopted Innovative and participative methods in holistic way which is reliable to Community Based Rehabilitation service and also for Community Development activities. In that way the year 2018-2019 is a period of time to build our institution stronger even though we faced challenges and hurdles during the service. For timely results active plans were made properly (Monthly and Quarterly basis) and all activities were implemented carefully with proper monitoring mechanism. A designed mile stone chart has adopted for tracking the projection of scheme/ project activities. Therefore this annual report will be a document to know about our achievements, lesson learned and will also be a key for future reference.

The year 2018-2019 is a period of time to travel in many aspects and beyond our achievements we got chances to gain knowledge in CBR service and Development activities beyond our achievements. **Global Special School for the Mentally Challenged** is one of the schemes supported by the State Commissionerate for the welfare of the Differently Abled, Chennai. The core intention of the scheme is to give residential care and rehabilitation service to Children with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities-IDDs for the age group of 06 to 18 years. Under this scheme we provided residential care to 97 Children. Significantly we noticed better improvements in ADL Skills, Social interaction, Peer Group involvement, Interest on Play activity. The parents/guardians of these children have satisfied about their children's improvement. The techniques of Individual based care and attention has given fruitful outcome in our special education methods. As the case of severely affected children multimodal therapy intervention has improved significantly the motor skills even though they require continuous intervention. Their health conditions have also improved better as expected due to balanced diet system.

SAMARTH Centre- Respite Care home a scheme supported by the National Trust, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Government of India. The basic idea of this scheme is to give residential care to Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities-IDDs approved by the National Trust and the families of the children who are under critical situation. Priority has given to Children under the Below the Poverty Line-BPL and Low Income Group-LIG. It also aims at creating opportunities for family members to get respite time in order to fulfill their responsibilities. In that way we developed this centre as a model home where the atmosphere is pleasant and inclusive nature to learn life skill education and to enjoy their times in better way. Special Education curriculum is entirely life oriented approach to empower Persons with Intellectual Disability for exposing their unique talents and for independent living. In this centre we have accommodated 35 Children priority has given to orphan, destitute and abandoned. They are getting full time care and support to overcome from their inability. Special Education, Therapeutically intervention and Psychological support have given to enrich their ability and to understand the environment.

Global Trust is empanelled by the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India for 2017-2020 as Project implementing Agency (PIA) to implement an exclusive scheme Nai-Roshni a training programme for Leadership development of Minority Women in Cuddalore District. The main objective of the programme is to empower and instill confidence in Women by providing knowledge, tools and techniques for interacting with Government systems, banks intermediaries at all levels. The scheme provides one week training programme followed by hand holding for one year. This training programme is provided on various training modules covering issues relating to women viz. Leadership of Women through participation in decision making, Educational programmes for women, Health and Hygiene, Legal rights of women, Financial Literacy, Digital Literacy, Swachh Bharat, Life Skills and Advocacy for Social and Behavioral Change. During FY 2018-19 this training has given to 5 batches of 125 Minority Women covering of 3 blocks in Cuddalore District. The post training support has also given to all trainees for economic empowerment through up scaling of existing technical skills and also under skill development training.

Global Autism centre under TamilNadu Chief Minister Comprehensive Health Insurance scheme (CMCHITN) is functioning as a multimodal therapy unit under the guidance of Medical Professionals, Special Educators and Rehabilitation professionals. The Main aim of the scheme is to identify autistic children for multimodal therapy to improve their daily living skills. Children are enrolled with proper assessment tools (CARS and ISSA) and therapy plan is also prepared based on the observation of Clinical Psychologist. A separate section was established with special provision of assistive therapy tools. During the FY 2018-19 20 Autistic children have enrolled for multimodal therapy service.

Skill training and livelihood promotion of PwDs is a challenging point which has given a tremendous exposure during the mobilization of disabled youths. LC Project, Nagapattinam a pioneer institution along with local partnering institutions is taking huge effort to capacitate the technical skill of Disabled youth and their livelihood promotion. On this line Global Trust as a local partnering institution has taken measure to train 30 youths on Mobile phone repairing service and home appliance service. This training programme was residential mode that covered a detailed syllabus for one month. All were assisted with working tool kit worth with Rs.5000/ each to make to involve into income generation activity at their local areas. To enhance the livelihood of the parents of Children with Intellectual Disabled who are studying in Global Special School action has taken to receive Tailoring machines from District Differently Abled Welfare Office, under this scheme 25 parents have supported and started tailoring shop at their home.

Furthermore we have also got opportunities to participating/ attending special events/ training programmes conducted by the various departments and Institutions. World Yoga Day, International Differently abled Day, National Children's Day, World Autism Day, Voter's Awareness Campaign, Disaster management, World Women's Day and sports and games are some of the events that were participated / conducted by us.

In sum up, the FY 2018-2019 is a period of time to travel in many aspects and a chance to gain more knowledge in CBR service and Development activities beyond our achievements

...a way forward towards Community Based Rehabilitation Service (CBR)...

Global Trust strongly believes since its inception that CBR is a strategy within the community development for the rehabilitation, equalization of opportunities, and social inclusion of PwDs. CBR entails holistic, social and participatory approaches in the field of Community Development Programme and it enables PwDs to contribute to development activities.

To reach the unreached segment especially Persons with Disabilities we make regular visit to villages and involved in awareness building among PwDs, their parents/ guardians and general public about the importance of Early Intervention for disability identification , Institutionalization of Children with Special Needs-CwSNs for Special Education and also for medical care intervention.

During the FY 2018-19 we visited 25 villages covering all the blocks of Cuddalore district and disseminated information about Special Education , Therapeutically intervention, advocacy service girl children related problems and given information about the government mechanism where they can get assistance, remedies and welfare services. The outcome of our service we built a strong awareness among the parents and to general public. The Parents of CwSNs made visit to Global Special School either by their own or by the community members or by officials like CWC, Hospitals reference.



Global Special School for Intellectual Disabled

LIFE SKILL EDUCATION UNDER RESIDENTIAL CARE:

GLOBAL Special School is a place of gardening where the Children with Special Needs –CwSNs can live on their own world. The atmosphere of the school is designed to encourage children to learn by their own on Activity of Daily Living (ADL) and social skill involvement. Parents and guardian of the children are also included as a part of our rehabilitation service. In class room atmosphere they have given education on the method of pre and post school rehabilitation service. The special education curriculum is designed with IQ level assessment by using proper check lists. Participatory Learning teaching method with Individualized Education Program (IEP) is adopted to improve the Motor skills, Academic skills, Social skills and Domestic activities of the children. Special attention is given to enhance the peer group involvement and self learning habits with intensive motivational approach. Pictorial posters, Toys, Play materials and Television facilities are also provided to improve their and leisure activities.



INCLUSIVE EDUCATION PLAN

To bridge the gap between the Children with Special Needs and Mainstream education system necessary action has taken to access normal school education. The main intension is to encourage Children with Intellectual disabilities who are assessed as mild and moderate categories to have an opportunity spending time with normal children in the school atmosphere. During the FY 2018-19 we enrolled 97 children and of them 12 were enrolled in integrated education system.

Special Education curriculum is entirely life oriented approach to empower Persons with Intellectual Disability for exposing their unique talents and for independent living. During the FY2018-19, 35 Children were accommodated and priority has given to orphan, destitute and abandoned. They are getting full time care and support to overcome from their inability. Special Education, Therapeutical intervention and Psychological support are given to enrich their ability and to enable them for inclusive life. As per the instruction given by the National Trust a monitoring committee called Local Project Committee-LPC has formed along with eminent persons like Teacher, Doctor, Advocate, Social Worker and Parents of CwSNs. to discuss the progress of the home, health and sanitation and safety measure. This committee has met once in 15 days and reviews all the activity of the centre.

Pre vocational training has also given to adult children for their skill development along with Special Education. They have taken to excursion visit to important places for acquiring social knowledge and react properly to environment. All children have also covered under Niramaya Insurance scheme.

....Children gets involved In House Keeping & Gardening Activity....!

To improve the life skills of CwSNs trainings are given on domestic and gardening activities. Adult Children are trained to involve into housekeeping, dinning maintenance and kitchen garden growing activities. The intention of training is to encourage children to know about the social environment and to understand their roles in domestic and gardening activity. Moreover they are happy while involving them physically in some work. It also built good peer group relation and paved the way for sharing their feeling while working together.

They themselves get ideas about seed sowing, plantation of saplings. Now they sowed mango and banana saplings and pouring water regularly. All saplings are getting growing fast with good energy.



Meeting with Parents & Local Project Committee...

To enable parents to know about the Special Education and rehabilitation service rendered to their children, parents and on these meetings all information about the progress of their Children has shared for discussion and further follow-ups. In addition to this Local Project Committee-LPC as per the guideline of the National Trust has formed with eminent persons like Teacher, Doctor, Advocate, Social Worker and Parents of CwSNs. to discuss about the progress of the School/ home, health and sanitation and safety measure. This committee has met at once in 15 days and reviews all the activity of the centre.

Apart from this, an inclusive system has also developed for connecting parents with institution. Parents either mother or father or guardian of children has to visit to school every day based on the visiting calendar provided to them for knowing class activity, therapy activity, dinning and other activities. This is a system created for understanding about the institution where their children are studying and what types of rehabilitation service are given. This system is a feedback mechanism to learn new ideas and suggestion from the parents.



Autism Centre under CMCHISTN

Global Special School is empanelled for running **Autism centre** under TamilNadu Chief Minister Comprehensive Programme (CMCHITN). The main aim of the project is to provide multimodal therapy to the Children with Autism Spectrum Disorders. A separate section is established for multimodal therapy contains assessment/ counseling rooms, Special Education class room, Therapeutical unit and other services. A team of resource persons consist of medical professionals, special educators and multimodal therapists are involved for assessment and therapy activities. During this FY 2018-19 we enrolled 10 Children and they were provided therapeutically intervention based on the training plan.

Nai-Roshni- Leadership Training to Minority Women

Nai-Roshni an exclusive training programme for Leadership development of Minority Women implemented all over India by the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt of India. Global Trust is empanelled as Project implementing Agency (PIA) for 2017-2020 The main objective



of the programme is to empower and instill confidence in Women by providing knowledge, tools and techniques for interacting with Government systems, banks intermediaries at all levels. The scheme provides one week training programme followed by hand holding for one year. This training programme is provided on various training modules covering issues relating to women viz. Leadership of Women through participation in decision making, Educational programmes for women, Health and Hygiene Legal rights of women, Financial Literacy, Digital Literacy, Swachh Bharat, Life Skills and Advocacy for Social and Behavioral Change. During the FY 2018-19 this training has given to 5 batches of 125 Minority Women covering 3 blocks in Cuddalore District.

Under the guidance and supervision of District Backward Communities and Minorities Welfare Officer, Cuddalore trainings were conducted and inaugurated by Government officials (DDAWO, DBC&MWO, Sub Collector, Cuddalore and DSWO). Eminent resource persons from various fields have engaged for effective training outcome. Based on the need assessment of training participant action has taken for economic empowerment as they have motivated to get skill based trainings in Paper Bag making, Tailoring and Sea beats making. They have also motivated for getting financial assistance from the department of DBC&MWO.

A self initiative project supported to school going children belonging to poor family background. Under this initiative we covered Stalin Nagar which is nearby slum area of Kammiyampattai located at the river bank of Gedilam. The residents of this area are basically migrated from various villages across Cuddalore District and residing here over more than one decade. The area has no Electricity power connection and street light provision even to their huts. All are daily wage bread winner and their children are studying in the nearest government schools. There are 23 children are identified to this tuition centre and they are given support to learn soft skills and extracurricular activities along with their regular studies. All services are rendered at free of cost.

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SKILL TRAINING TO DISABLED YOUTHS

Assurance for Inclusive growth of PwDs is basically depending upon Skill based Training and better livelihood opportunities. To enable PwDs for sustainable livelihood promotion, action has been taken for conducting Skill training on various trades which are feasible and opted for PwDs. In Global vocational training unit we are providing training on Paper bag making and handy works. 12 Adult children with Intellectual Disabled are undergoing training regularly.

During the FY 2018-19 an exclusive skill training programme on Mobile phone repairing service and Home appliance service was conducted for 30 Youths covering cross disability supported by LC Project, Nagapattinam. The intention of the training is to capacitate the technical skill of disabled youths in Cell phone repairing service and Home appliance service and make them to start income generation at their locality. A month long residential training was given at Global Trust training hall with necessary training kit tools. This training programme was such an effort for economic empowerment and their independent life. All trainees were assisted with working tool kit worth with Rs.5000/ each as post training support.

Now all the trained youths are involved in self employment activity at their locality and earning decent income. Moreover to enlarge their business activity they decided and mobilized into Shelf Help Group-SHG for getting financial linkage from bank. Thanks to LC Project, Nagapattinam for this opportunity.

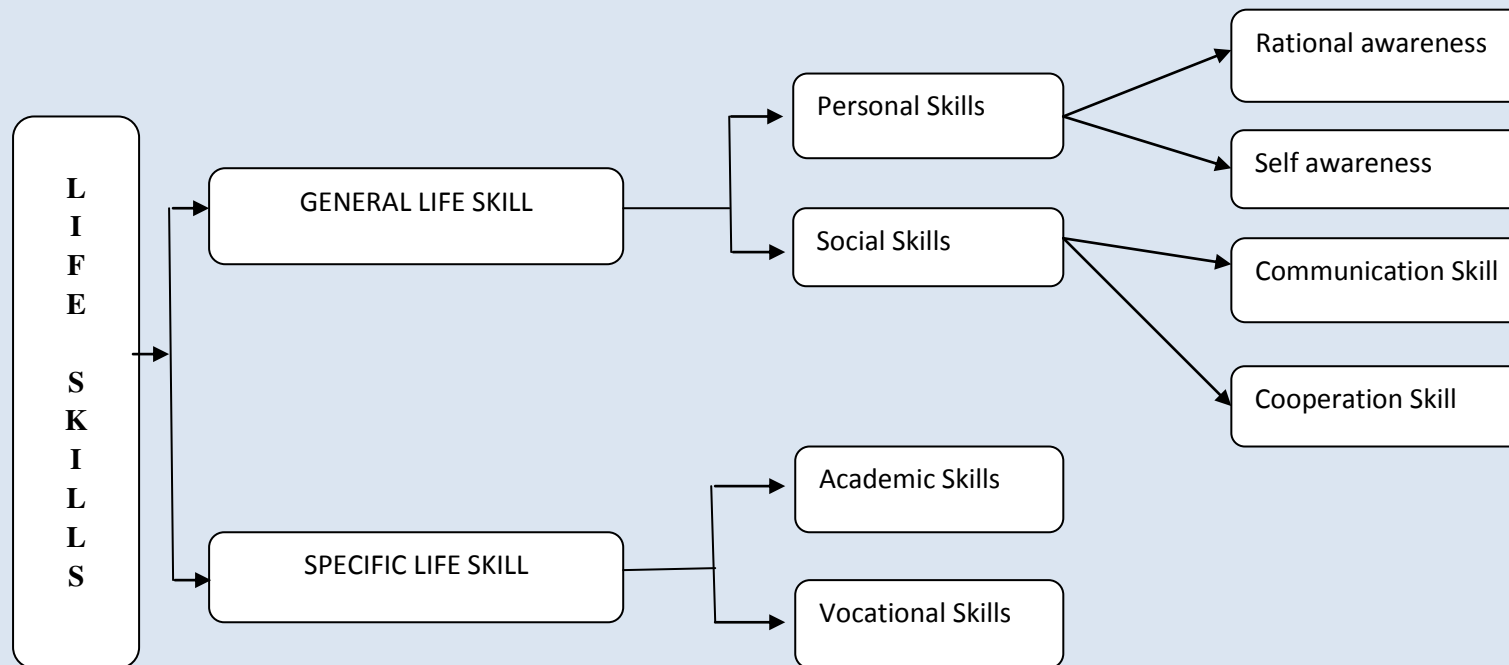

CASE STUDY & SUCCESS STORY

Child able to walk by sensory skills

A small male child by name Ashraf Ali with severe Intellectual disability was admitted in 5 years back. He was identified as a child with facing multi problems- Speechless, Sensory failure, ADL dependency, Low vision and medically he affected by lack of immunity power with seizure disorders. The child showed strong fear in foot stepping, touching things and even to soft things.

Based on the assessment priority has given to sensory stimulation training and exposed him into sensory things. It was a prolong effort the child has taken to get touch with different objects.

Improvement observed gradually month by month and he started to like to touch soft objects as well as stated to walk slowly. Now he is able to walk up to toilet without assistance and started to hold things, toys and much liked touch all kinds of sensory kits.

His parents much more satisfied with his improvement and eager to learn about therapy skills.

Multimodal Therapies bring a fast change in Autistic Child's life

Master Hariharn a little boy came to admission at the age of 7. When got admission he was identified as stereotyped behavior and always like loneliness. During the clinical assessment it was observed that the child was affected by mild Autism spectrum disorders and he was lacked in sensory integration, communication skill and social skills. He was not able to cope with sounds even hand clapping. He unusually cried and ran here and there when approach him.

He was recommended for multimodal therapy to get relive from his problems. A designed therapy plan was made and given training on sensory integration- face to face contact, sitting together with peer group, motivated to speak out single words and stories and taken him to expose peer group involvement-play activities.

The outcome of multimodal therapy is very tangible as he is now able ask something with others, obey the commands, increased face to face response , started play with others and he is enjoying his time with peers happily even though he needs to travel much more for his independent life.

His mother wonders with her child's improvement and saying thanks to his teachers.



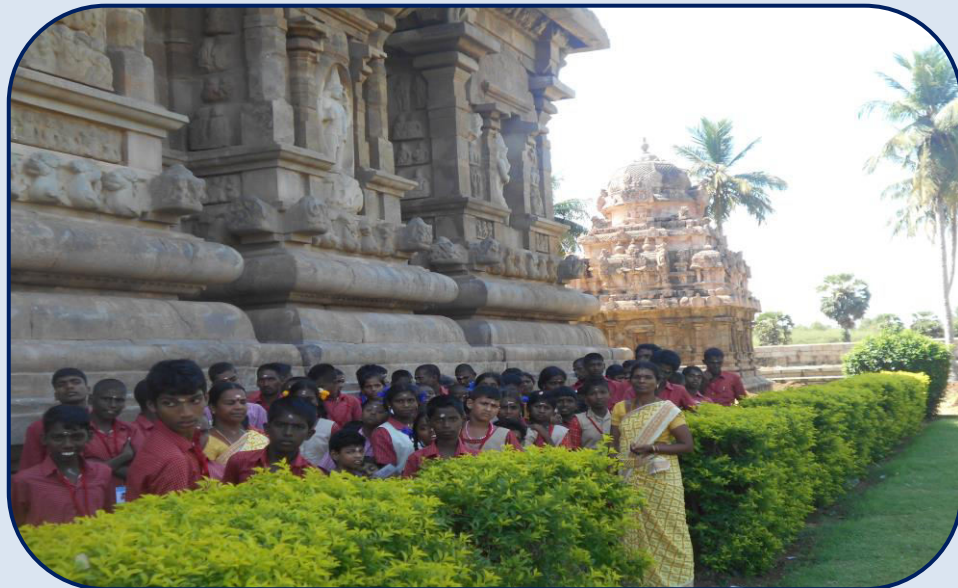

VOTERS AWARENESS CAMPAIGN


